Land Rewoven comprises a considered body of work by MJ Lourens in conversation with selected paintings of JH Pierneef from the La Motte Museum collection. The exhibition was inspired by the notion of recontextualising Pierneef's well-known oeuvre within a contemporary dialogue. It explores the interpretation of land by two South African artists from different generations, whose work could broadly be classified within the same genre.

Lourens' expansive land- and cityscapes invite the viewer to join an exchange of ideas surrounding themes of geographical place, memory and identity and to read them in relation to Pierneef's work. His paintings, despite elements of visual resemblance, subtly resist the perfect harmony of the untainted traditional landscape. Lourens' practice involves an ongoing process of observing a more urban South African landscape and thoughtfully portraying the complexities thereof. Presented in collaboration with Barnard Gallery.

1. IZIXAZULULO (SOLUTIONS) BY SIBUSISO DUMA

Sibusiso Duma is searching for solutions to his life and environment and through this investigation; he shares the stories of his childhood, his social opinions and the beliefs of his culture. His pictorial stories enrich one deeply with an understanding of his life and strikingly, it is the dominance of the human figure in his work which underlines his strong visual language. Sibusiso Duma was born in Mbumbulu, KwaZulu Natal in 1978. He has been exhibited frequently both locally and internationally including notable solo exhibitions at Stevenson and ABSA Gallery, Johannesburg and the AVA Gallery, Cape Town. His works are included in important private and public collections.

2. UNDERPINNINGS BY MARK RAUTENBACH

Mark Rautenbach's latest body of work, 'Underpinnings' looks at unseen forces and tensions, which are inside, beneath, behind and between visible things. Materially, this is expressed by securing, stretching and suspending fine, colourful hand-knitted circular fabrics attached by small gold safety pins. These materials have no intrinsic value and as separate actions they go largely unnoticed. However, when combined in such a manner, they give form to something striking, complex, vital, and compelling. Mark Rautenbach (1964 -) currently lives and works in Cape Town. His artworks have been included in a number of significant public exhibitions, commissions and residencies.

ANGELA BANKS – DEEP IN THE QUIET

Angela Banks is a fine artist from Johannesburg. She received a BA (Fine Arts) in 1999 and MA (Fine Arts) in 2003 from the University of Pretoria. She has since exhibited in various group and solo shows and has been on residencies in France and China. Banks is inextricably connected to the portrait (both human and animal) and uses friends, family and intriguing strangers as subjects. Her work however, is not just a simple documentation. Banks is interested in what the individual projects but more importantly, she is after what lies behind the projection. The depiction of the relationship between human and animal stems back to our prehistoric ancestors who shared their world in paint on cave walls. As John Berger notes, our first paintings and symbols were animals, paradoxically 'what distinguished man from animals was born out of our relationship with them'. It

therefore makes sense to Banks that visually juxtaposing human and animal exposes the large and small intricacies of our humanity.
